

Herman Steiner was at the time on a visit to Los Angeles, during which he played a short match against A. J. Fink, California champion. This he won by 2—0. He also played in the "radio" match *v.* Rosario, as we recorded last month; and gave a simultaneous exhibition against a very strong team at the San Francisco C.C., winning fourteen games, drawing one, and losing two.

Annexed is a curious ending in a game won by H. Steiner against "an amateur" in his home at Pasadena. It is sent to us by A. J. Jameson.

It was Black's turn to move, and he played R—Q 7, to which White replied K—B 2?, losing in a few moves. Steiner points out that White overlooked R—Q 1, with prospects of a draw.
