Alan Benson directed the second annual October Festival Chess Tournament on the University of California Berkeley campus, Oct. 20-21. The four-round, USCF-CalChess Swiss system competition, sponsored by SUPERB and the U.C. Berkeley Campus Chess Club, attracted 57 players vying for a share of the \$557 cash prize fund plus \$41 in California Chess Bulletins gift certificates.
