LERA PENINSULA CLASS TOURNAMENT RESULTS

The 16th annual LERA Peninsula Class Chess Tournament attracted 123 players to Lockheed's Sunnyvale plant, March 14-15. Jim Hurt and Ted Yudacufski directed the four-round, USCF-rated Swiss system event with a prize fund of \$2,603.
