EXPERIMENTAL TOURNAMENT

At the City Terrace Chess Club, Jan.13-14-15

H. D. RADER, one of the southland's most active players and most experienced organizers and tournament directors, has advanced a new and controversial idea for weekend tournaments, and the City Terrace Chess Club is going to sponsor an EXPERIMENTAL TOURNAMENT to try it out. Certainly tournament directors will welcome the idea, but it depends on player acceptance. To explain:-

It is common practice to schedule games on a 5-hour basis (e.g., 9 a.m., 2 p.m., 7 p.m.) when playing six rounds over a weekend - and although most games are completed in 4 hrs. and players have an hour or so to rest between rounds, a number of games are invariably late in finishing or must be adjourned. Pairings based on a quick mental assessment often prove false; which can be embarrassing especially in the late rounds. Completion of adjourned fifth-round games after conclusion of the tournament can play havoc with results and prize distribution. The new proposal eliminates ALL these bugaboos. Now we have an idea whereby ALL GAMES are completed in 4 hours; all players have an hour between games, the T.D. has one full hour for uncomplicated pairings, and ALL GAMES in a round start on time.

How is this achieved? Proposed: No move-limit is instituted on the games, only TIME-LIMIT. Two hours on each clock; when the flag falls, the flag-fallee loses. Sort of like a two-hour rapid transit.

It's that simple. Such a tourney may produce more draws due to time-pressure, but we have seen that same thing occur many times in master and grandmaster tournaments. How will it work? Well, it has to be tried! Incidentally, whether such an event would be rated by the USCF or not, we are trying to find out now. By our next issue, we'll have the answer. Make your plans now - usual entry fee, \$10.50.
