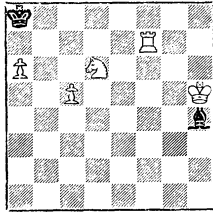

Emil Bersbach of Santa Monica and Imre Barlai of San Diego dominated the fourth annual San Bernardino Open, drawing their game and winning their other five games. There were 60 players in the tournament held May 5-6.

### CUNNINGHAM NEW COLLEGE CHAMPION

Walt Cunningham of Los Angeles State College won the fourth annual California College title at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, April 20-21. Cunningham's score was  $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ . In second place was Stephen Matzner of Cal Poly, 4-1, the defending champion. Cesar Marin of L. A. State was third,  $3\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$  -- the only player to draw with Cunningham.

### ROY HOPPE WINS MECHANICS' INSTITUTE OPEN

Roy Hoppe won a 5-round Swiss held in San Francisco in May, 4-1. Hoppe won three games and drew with Don Sutherland and Horst Bullwinkel, who were among the five players who tied for second.

BERSBACH WINS 4TH ANNUAL SAN BERNARDINO OPEN

Emil Bersbach of Santa Monica won the trophy and divided the 1st and 2nd place money of \$125 and \$75 with Imre Barlai of San Diego in the 6-round Swiss held May 5-6 at San Bernardino Valley College. Bersbach and Barlai tied with  $5\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$  scores, and Bersbach won the trophy by tie-breaking points. Allan Troy, president of the Southern California Chess League, tied for third at 5-1 with E. Wicher and J.C. Scheuerman. California co-champion Irving Rivise took sixth place.

Frank Metz of Northridge and Zoltan Kocsis of Fort Ord won prizes as highest-scoring "A" players. Donn Rogosin of Los Angeles and Jim Dietrich of San Diego were the top "B" players and Randy Kluz of Los Angeles won the "C" prize. Mrs. Doris Miller of Los Angeles was the best woman player. Tournament director was Dr. Allen Hendy.

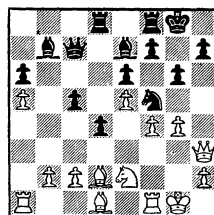

The finish has some neat points, based on Black's threat to place his Queen on the long diagonal. This he never does, but the threat proves stronger than the execution.

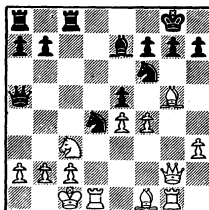

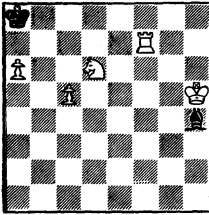

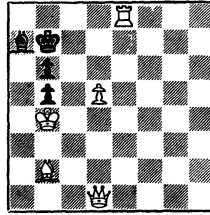
TASKS: These two examples, composed a century apart, show that problems still depend for their appeal on elements of surprise, neatness, or "puzzlement" which all players can appreciate. In the first case, however, there happens to be a simple example of "mirror" strategy -- mates or maneuvers which are similar, but on different squares of the board. No. 191 features a single striking line of play -- sometimes called a "cameo."
