Your Rung Along the Chronicle Chess Ladder

One point will be given to all contestants who send in a solution—right or wrong; two points for each correct solution of a two-mover; one additional point for "cooks" (more than one correct key move); two points for a no-solution claim if justified (we do not print "no-solution" problems intentionally—but when such a problem does turn up, your claim of a "no solution" gets you two points); four points for each correct solution to a three-mover. Only key moves should be sent for two-movers. Previous prize winners are indicated by asterisks (*).
