CALLED TO THE PHONE HE DID NOT HESITATE TO BREAK HIS CONCENTRATION AND LISTEN WITH GENUINE INTEREST TO STRANGERS! PROBLEMS. THEY HAD NOT REALLY INTERRUPTED HIM!...EVERYONE KNEW THAT HIS CALL WAS WELCOME WHETHER DURING MEALS OR AT 3 A.M.!

WITH LARGE STEPS THAT RESOUNDED THROUGHOUT THE CLUB, SPREADING LIFE, HOPE AND JOY, HE LAUGHED WITH ONE, ENCOURAGED ANOTHER, CRACKED A JOKE WITH ANOTHER. A TWINKLE WAS STILL IN HIS EYE AS HE SAT DOWN AGAIN, AND, AS IF NOTHING HAD HAPPENED WAS SUDDENLY PLUNGED INTO DEEP CONCENTRATION. THIS WAS ONLY FOUR HOURS BEFORE HE PASSED AWAY.

HE GAVE WITHOUT RESERVE OF HIS DYNAMIC PERSON-ALITY, SPREADING WARMTH, HOPE, ENTHUSIASM, AND NEW IDEAS. REGARDLESS OF APPRECIATION OR RECOG-NITION HE UNCONDITIONALLY CAME BACK READY TO HELP; GAVE STRENGTH AND PUSHED FORWARD EVERYONE HE EN-COUNTERED.

EVERY CHESS CLUB IN THE WORLD LEADS A PRECARIOUS FX-ISTENCE. EVEN THE MOST ECONOMICAL MANAGEMENT OFTEN FAILS TO MEET EXPENSES. IN SUCH A SITUATION THE QUESTION INEVITABLY ARISES: HOW CAN WE INCREASE OUR INCOME?

THIS WAS THE MAIN PROBLEM CONSIDERED BY SOME THIRTY MEMBERS WHO GATHERED AT THE STEINER CLUB ON NOVEMBER 8TH FOR OUR 2ND GENERAL MEETING. WE WERE ALSO HON-ORED BY THE PRESENCE OF GRANDMASTER ISAAC KASHDAN.

THE TREASURER'S REPORT. READ BY IRVING RIVISE, RE-VEALED A BANK BALANCE OF ONLY \$39. WITH OUR NOVEMBER RENT STILL UNPAID. THIS ALARMING CONDITION WAS AS-CRIBED MAINLY TO THE UNEXPECTED FAILURE OF 18 FRESH-MAN MEMBERS TO RENEW, AFTER A SIX MONTHS TRIAL PERIOD.

CERTAIN ASPECTS OF THE MEMBERSHIP SITUATION WERE BROUGHT OUT IN MY REPORT: THE OFT-REPEATED DEVICE OF BRINGING IN NEW MEMBERS WAS BEGINNING TO WEAR THIN: THE LOSS OF OUR LATELY-ENROLLED MEMBERS COULD BE CLEARLY TRACED TO FAILURE OF THE OLDER MEMBERS TO WELCOME, ENCOURAGE, AND ABSORB THIS WEDNESDAY NIGHT GROUP; MANY POTENTIAL NEW MEMBERS INSPECTING THE CLUB FOR THE FIRST TIME ARE LOST BECAUSE THERE IS NOBODY PRESENT TO GREET THEM AND INTEREST THEM IN BECOMING MEMBERS. ALL OF WHICH AFFECTS OUR COLLECTIVE POCKET BOOK .

ALSO, IN CONFINING OUR EXPENSES TO THE MINIMUM (RENT, STATIONERY, POSTAGE AND EXCISE TAX) WE ARE NEGLECTING TO IMPROVE OUR CLUB. WE NEED MONEY FOR REPAIRS. ACQUISITION AND AMORTIZATION OF EQUIPMENT; FOR A DRINKING FOUNTAIN; AND FOR PUBLICITY, INCLUDING THE

GEORGE GOEHLER POINTED OUT THAT WE SHOULD HAVE A CON-TINGENCY FUND OF AT LEAST \$500 IN ORDER TO BE IN BUSI-

CLUB BULLETIN.

NESS ON A SOLID FINANCIAL BASIS. THE MEETING WAS THEN 5 THROWN OPEN FOR DISCUSSION.

MOST OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT FELT THAT AN INCREASE IN DUES WOULD BE THE SIMPLE AND PRACTICAL SOLUTION. THIS THOUGHT WAS EMPHATICALLY OPPOSED HOWEVER BY MR. BISNO. MR. KOVACS. AND MR. KASHDAN. MR. BISNO THEN PROPOSED OUR SOLICITING SPONSORS! DONATIONS INSTEAD.

AT THIS POINT VICE-PRESIDENT RUBIN CAME UP WITH A BRILLIANCY!! HIS IDEA WHICH WAS ENDORSED UNANIMOUSLY BY THE MEMBERS PRESENT HAS BEEN NAMED THE GUARANTOR'S PLAN. .. WILL YOU BE A GUARANTOR?..

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS. YOU GUARANTEE THAT YOU WILL BRING IN A NEW MEMBER DURING 1957. YOU PAY HIS DUES NOW. (THEY MAY BE SPLIT INTO TWO SEMI-ANNUAL PAYMENTS). YOUR MONEY IS REFUNDED AS SOON AS YOUR NEW MEMBER PAYS HIS DUES. BY THIS METHOD YOU ARE HELPING YOUR CLUB TO STAY OPEN, AND AT NO COST TO YOU. SO LONG AS YOU SUC-CEED IN BRINGING IN A NEW MEMBER. BE A GUARANTOR! BUT IF YOU CAN'T AFFORD TO, DESPITE THE LACK OF RISK, THERE ARE OTHER WAYS TO HELP YOUR CLUB OUT OF ITS CRISIS. WILL YOU BE A HOST?

THE DUTIES INVOLVED ARE SIMPLE. YOU OPEN THE CLUB AND CLOSE IT. YOU KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR PEOPLE WHO WISH TO PLAY GAMES, AND TRY TO MATCH PLAYERS AS EVENLY AS POSSIBLE. YOU GREET STRANGERS WHO WANDER IN, GIVE OR GET THEM A GAME. GIVE THEM SOME CLUB LITERATURE. AND ACCEPT THEIR MONEY IF YOU TALK THEM INTO JOINING. YOU CREATE A FRIENDLY ATMOSPHERE.

GEORGE GOEHLER HAS DONE WONDERS ALONG THESE LINES. BUT HE AND YOUR CLUB OFFICERS CANNOT ATTEND EVERY CLUB NIGHT. FOR THIS REASON WE ARE ASKING FOR VOLUNTFER HOSTS WHO WILL TAKE CHARGE OF THE CLUB TWO AFTERNOONS OR EVENINGS A MONTH.

1956 SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHAMPIONSHIP (CONDENSED FROM CHESS REPORTER)

ON SUNDAY AUGUST 19, 1956 AT THE HERMAN STEINER CHESS CLUB THERE GATHERED 42 PLAYERS TO COMPETE FOR FOUR PLACES IN THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS. AS USUAL IN THIS EVENT THERE WAS A STRONG CONTINGENT OF VETERANS (ALMGREN, BOROCHOW, BOB CROSS, JACOBS, MARTIN AND RIVISE) WHO HAD BEEN DOMINATING THE SCENE FOR SOME YEARS.

THIS YEAR WITNESSED THE BREAK-THROUGH OF THE EVER-PRESENT AND CHALLENGING YOUNGSTERS WHO CAPTURED TWO OF THE
FOUR PRIZE WINNING PLACES. 15 YEAR OLD LARRY REMLINGER
CAPTURED FIRST PLACE QUITE EASILY, AND A NEWCOMER AND
ALSO 15 YEARS OLD, STEPHEN SHOLOMSON GAVE A FINE ACCOUNTING OF HIS CHESS ABILITIES BY PLACING FOURTH.

SAM GELLER WON SECOND PLACE OUTRIGHT WHILE IRVING RIVISE
TOOK THIRD BY REASON OF THE "INGLEWOOD" TIE BREAKING
SYSTEM.

LARRY REMLINGER STARTED OFF BY WINNING HIS FIRST SIX GAMES COUNTING AMONG HIS VICTIMS, MARTIN, BOROCHOW AND CROSS. IN THE SEVENTH ROUND HE GAVE UP HIS FIRST HALF POINT BY DRAWING WITH RIVISE. BY DRAWING AGAIN WITH GELLER IN THE 8TH ROUND AND SHOLOMSON IN THE 9TH ROUND LARRY ALLOWED THE REST OF THE FIELD TO COME CLOSE, BUT NOT CLOSE ENOUGH.

GELLER IN WINNING SECOND PLACE, LOST BUT ONE GAME TO RIVISE. HE PLAYED EXCELLENT CHESS THROUGHOUT THE TOUR-NAMENT, AND HIS VAULT TO THE TOP RANKS, UPSET MANY A SCORE.

RIVISE FOR A LONG TIME DURING THE TOURNAMENT WAS REM-LINGER'S CLOSEST PURSUER. WHEN THESE TWO MET IN THE 7TH ROUND, REMLINGER WAS LEADING WITH 6-0, FOLLOWED BY RIVISE WITH 5-1. YOUNG SHOLOMSON, WHO HAS TO HIS CREDIT TWO VICTORIES OVER SAMMY RESHEVSKY IN SIMULTANEOUS EXHIBITIONS, PLAYS A VERY ENTERPRISING AND ENERGETIC BRAND OF CHESS.

MR. CHARLES KODIL DIRECTED THE TOURNAMENT AND SCHEDULED THE PAIRINGS IN HIS USUAL RELIABLE FASHION. WE ARE FORTUNATE INDEED TO HAVE THE SERVICES OF A MAN WITH MR. KODIL'S INTEGRITY AND COMPETENCE.
