The fifth place was captured by William Lombardy of the U. S. The final scores of the seven leaders: P. Keres 15-2; M. Najdorf 14-3; A. Kotov and O. Panno 13-4; W. Lombardy 11½-5½; R. Sanguinetti 10½-6½; M. Cuellar 8½-8½.

Dublin, Ireland, has announced that it will mark the 100th anniversary of Paul Morphy's trip to Europe with a masters tournament. This meet will be held in connection with the An Tostal Festival chess tournament next month. A. O'Kelly of Brussels, Belgium, won first place in all three of the An Tostal Tournaments held so far.

In the world-championship match, after the 17th game, the score is V. Smyslov 9½, M. Botvinnik 7½.
