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LEADERS TIED IN CHAMPIONS TOURNEY





Earlier this year an interesting tournament took place in Iceland, in which a couple of grandmasters and other visitors, were matched with the leading native masters. Former world champion Mik-

hail Tal of Latvia had one of his great successes, winning 12 games and allowing only one draw against Gudmundur Palmason.

In second place was Svetozar Gligoric of Yugoslavia, who finished with 11½-1½. His loss was to Tal and the draw against Svein Johannessen.

Johannessen tied at 9-4 with Iceland's only grandmaster, Fridrik Olafsson. The latter was clearly not in his best form, losing three games outright, to the two leaders and Robert G. Wade of England.
