

- (a) U.S. champion Bobby Fischer once wrote that this defense (the Berlin Defense Deferred) wins for Black by force.
- (b) Fischer contends that 6 P-B3 is necessary to protect the QP.
- (c) White has a good position after 7 . . . N-KB3 8 P-K5 PxP 9 NxP 0-0 10 P-KR4 B-K3 11 BxB PxB 12 PxP PxP 13 P-KN3. On 7 . . . N-QB3 there follows 8 N-K2 KN-K2 9 NxP PxN 10 BxP, with an attack.
 - (d) Black's defense hinges on the occupation of his KB5, which stops White's heavy pieces from crashing in at KB7. White must batter down this barrier at all cost or lose.
 - (e) An unexpected move that places White in dire straits White obtains an attacking position after 8 . . . B-N5 9 PxP BxN 10 RxB PxP 11 BxP PxB 12 RxP.
 - (f) Desperation, but 9 N-K2 P-N5 10 N-Q2 QxP 11 RxP 0-0 12 P-B3 B-K3 13 P-Q5 N-K4 14 B-N3 B-QB1 15 N-Q4 P-RR4 allows Black to keep the Pawn and finish his development.
 - (g) If 10 N-R2 or 10 N-K1, then 10 . . . BxPch 11 K-R1 BxN 12 PxB N-K4 13 B-N3 PxP wins.
 - (h) And not 11 . . . BxPch 12 K-R1, with strong pres-
 - (i) Black is safe after 12 Q-R5 B-K3 13 B×B N×B, since 14 B×QP meets with 14 . . . QxB 15 QxPch K-Q1 16 QR-Q1 (16 N-N5 QxPch) B-Q5ch 17 K-R1 N-B3, followed by 18 . . .
 - (j) Returning a piece in order to reach the ending a piece and position up.
 - (k) White was in severe time trouble here, but even 19 PxN BxPch 20 K-N2 P-B3 21 N-B3 BxN 22 PxB K-K2 wins easily for Black.
 - (1) Black's KN gave more than his fair share in this Interesting game. *
