RUB-ON CHESS DIAGRAMS

Chess players who wish to record (correspondence) game positions, adjournments, end-game studies and the like will welcome a new product for chess diagrams called Chessprint Transfers.

Chessprints are applied to blank diagrams by rubbing off chess symbols from a specially printed sheet with a pencil point or pen tip. The transferred pieces may be removed easily with a regular pencil eraser, but resist rubbing and scratching.

SUNNYVALE CLASS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 12th annual Lockheed Employees Recreation Association Sunnyvale Class Championships will take place in the LERA Auditorium, corner of Mathilda Avenue and Java Street in Sunnyvale, Sept. 30 and Oct. 1. (Take Bayshore Freeway to North Mathilda exit, then go seven blocks north to Java).

Jim Hurt will be in charge of the five-round, USCF-rated Swiss system event in seven divisions, with tournament direction by Ted Yudacufski of Monterey.

Cash prizes, based on 30 to 50 entries in each section, will be awarded to the various class winners: 1st Open, \$500, 2nd \$250, 3rd \$150, 4th \$100; 1st A, \$350, 2nd \$175, 3rd \$90, 4th \$60; 1st B, \$350, 2nd \$175, 3rd \$90, 4th \$60; 1st C, \$300, 2nd \$150, 3rd \$90, 4th \$60; 1st D, \$300, 2nd \$150, 3rd \$90, 4th \$60; 1st E, \$100, 2nd \$60, 3rd \$40; 1st Unrated, \$100, 2nd \$60, 3rd 40.

To save a \$5 late charge, mail entries are advised. Remit \$30 for the Open Division, \$25 for Class A, \$20 for Class B, \$15 for Class C or D, \$10 for Class E or the Unrated Division by Sept. 27 to LERA Chess Club, Jim Hurt, Director, P.O. Box 60451, Sunnyvale, Calif. 94088. USCF and CalChess memberships are required.

Round one begins at 10 a.m., Saturday, Sept. 30, at a time control of 40 moves in 90 minutes (rounds four and five, 40 in 100). Please bring sets and clocks.
