
# BAY AREA TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

Here is a position from a game played by member Dan McLeod (black) in the S F City Championships in 1959. Black (X) to move and win.



l..., QxNchl; (if 2 PxQ, RxRch; 3 Q-Ql, RxQch; 4 KxR, NxBPch; and black is a piece and pawn up.) (or 2 PxQ, RxRch; 3 K-K2, NxBPchl taking a "family portrait" of the King and Queen) 2 K-K2, RxPch; 3 RxR, QxRch; 4 K-Q3, Q-N8ch; 5 K-K3, (if 5 Q-B2, B-R3ch) Q-K8ch; and white resigned.
