HARRY BOROCHOW FIRST ELECTEE TO HALL OF FAME

The weekend of Sep 30-Oct 1-2 at the Atlas Chess Club, headquarters of the Southern California Chess League, was indeed one to behold. The SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHAMPIONSHIPS, organized by Benton JAMES under the sponsorship of the So. Calif. Chess League, and directed by League Tournament Director Arthur SPILLER, drew the greatest number of entrants in any tournament that we know of in the southland, in fact, with the exception of the U.S. Open in San Francisco, in the whole of the state. Was the big attraction the new "Class Championship" concept? Were the players still riding on the enthusiasm of the recent PIATIGORSKY CUP? Or was it just the result of a tremendous publicity campaign? Time and comments will tell. In any case, with such participation we are beginning to approach the great numbers entering some of the eastern tournaments - which is only fitting, considering the progress of chess in the southland in the last few years.

The tournament was held in five sections: Open (masters and experts plus anyone who preferred this to the class sections), Class A, Class B, Class C, Class D and unrated. Top prizes for each section, and the top four from the Open section qualify into the State Championship. The qualifiers:
