AT THE HALFWAY MARK!

Svetozar GLIGORIC of Yugoslavia leads by a $\frac{1}{2}$ point, ahead of KERES and NAJDORF. GLIGORIC is the only undefeated player in the tournament -- he has two wins and five draws for a tally of $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$.

Every player has won at least once, and no one has more than two wins. It shows the extremely close struggle that's been standard for the PIATIGORSKY CUP right from the start. Of the 28 games played in the first half of the tournament, 13 have been won, a good proportion for grandmaster chess. Quite unusual is the proportion of white wins, 11 to 2! And oddly enough, both the black wins were by KERES.

PETROSIAN moved up in the center and queenside and seemed to have a good initiative in the early play. OLAFSSON countered by advancing his kingside pawns, carving out space for his pieces on that side.

There was little real contact of the forces. When a couple of minor pieces showed signs of activity, they were promptly traded off. In fact, when the draw was agreed, there was as much play in the position as at any prior time.
